Applying for ACICIS' Law Professional Practicum at ANU College of Law

Important:

Before applying for the [Law Professional Practicum](#) at www.acicis.edu.au/apply-now, please consider the following:

1 Eligibility

A student must meet the following criteria to apply for a short-term study abroad program:

- completed at least six law courses (LLB) or a year of full-time law (JD) at ANU by the time the study abroad program begins;
- a GPA of 5 or above at the time of application.

2 Tuition fees

All students will be required to pay the [ACICIS tuition fees](#) for the program directly to ACICIS.

3 New Colombo Plan Mobility Grant

There are a number of \$4,000 [New Colombo Plan Mobility Grants](#) available to support eligible students on the Law Professional Practicum. To apply for this funding, students need to apply for the program. ACICIS will then assess the eligibility of the student and the grant will be awarded if the student meets all of the following criteria:

- The student is a current undergraduate (Bachelor or Honours Degree) student
- The student is studying at an ACICIS Member University
- The student is an Australian citizen
- The student will be receiving credit towards my degree for participation in this program
- The student has not previously received two New Colombo Plan mobility grants for in-country study*
- The student is not a citizen or permanent resident of the Republic of Indonesia

*Students can receive a maximum of two New Colombo Plan mobility grants for in-country programs over the course of their studies.

*70% of grant recipients (Australia-wide) must be between the ages of 18-28.

5 Application process

Step 1: Register your interest with ACICIS Study Indonesia

- A. Email the Secretariat at enquiries@acicis.edu.au or call 08 6488 6675.

Step 2: Consult the Exchange Office

- A. Read the ANU Law Information available [here](#).
- B. Contact the College of Law Student Office at enquiries.law@anu.edu.au to ensure you have room in your degree for a 6 unit Law Elective.
- C. Once you receive a 'credit approval letter' from the Exchange Office, submit your ACICIS application.

Step 3: Submit your application to ACICIS Study Indonesia

- A. Complete your [application](#) for the ACICIS Law Professional Practicum.
- B. Students eligible to receive a New Colombo Plan grant will be considered as part of the application process.
- C. Students will receive the outcome of their ACICIS application within one month of the ACICIS Application closing deadline, and students will be notified if they will be awarded a New Colombo Plan grant.
